WAYNE CAVANAUGH

Wayne Cavanaugh is a third-generation dog fancier. His grandfather, John Cavanaugh, bred Kerry Blue Terriers; his father, Raymond Cavanaugh, bred English Setters and Beagles. Wayne and his wife Cheryl bred and exhibited Pointers, English Setters, and Beagles. Their Pointers have won major awards at six AKC American Pointer Club Nationals, all owner-handled, the first of which was Best of Winners in 1974 and Best of Breed in 1980. "Myles", Ch. Rossenarra Amontillado, was the second orange and white in history to win the AKC Pointer National and, while only used six times as a sire, was an APC Top Sire and sire of four Best in Show Winners. The Cavanaugh's "Derby," Ch. Rossenarra Impudence, was Top Producing Dam of the Year for all sporting breeds and the dam of Ch. Onsage Devil his Due who was also a top producer and the sire of Ch. Onsage Tiznow Bravura, a top winner in Canada and BOW at the APC National.

Wayne has judged gundogs, hounds, and terriers in the USA, Canada, Ireland, Japan, and Mexico. National Specialty assignments include the AKC Irish Setter National, the AKC English Setter National, the CKC Irish Setter National, Pointer and Setter Specialties at the Irish Kennel Club Saint Patrick's Show, and the Irish Gundog Field and Show Society.

Wayne served as Vice President of the American Kennel Club from 1991 to 1997, and President of the United Kennel Club from 1999 to 2014. He was a Charter Board Member of the AKC Canine Health Foundation.

For more than 20 years, he appeared on behalf of purebred dogs as a television commentator in the USA on every major network and in England for the BBC at *Crufts*, the world's largest dog show. He is the author of *The Inheritance of Coat Color in Pointers* and *Assessing the Show Pointer*, currently writes a monthly column for *Canine Chronicle*, and hosts the "The Dog Show Drive" weekly podcast with Will Alexander.

In 2010, Mr. Cavanaugh was named by Dog Fancy Magazine to the list of *Top 40 Most Influential People in Dogs*, along with Betty White, Cesar Milan, and Doris Day. He and his wife Cheryl live in Michigan. Their son, Brody Myles Cavanaugh, represents the fourth generation of Cavanaugh's as a pointer exhibitor and was a co-owner of the 2015 Westminster Best in Show winner, the Beagle "Miss P", Ch. Tashtins Lookin for Trouble for the majority of her career.
